




In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius

high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas,










Repentance


- * = "changing one's attitude and orientation that results in a new relation to God and fellow humans" (Robert C. Tannehill)




- * The ax is already at the root of the trees.

Darrell Bock:

"John illustrates how the proclaimer of the Word should perform his task. The preacher must bear good news as well as news that exposes sin ... A preacher of God's message must be balanced in delivering both messages.

Forgiveness cannot occur except where one realizes responsibility for sin and repents of it."
