





Creed =


- ❖ From the Latin *credo* = I believe
- ❖ a set of beliefs or aims which guide someone's actions
- ❖ a formal statement of Christian beliefs, especially the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed.

“Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD *is* one! You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.”



Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed

I believe in One God,
the Father Almighty,
Maker of Heaven and Earth,
and of all things visible and invisible.

Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed

And in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Son of God, the Only-Begotten,
begotten of the Father before all ages;
Light of Light;
True God of True God;
begotten, not made;
of one essence with the Father,
by Whom all things were made;

Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed

Who for us men and for our salvation
came down from Heaven,
and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary,
and became man.

And He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate,
and suffered, and was buried.

Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed

And the third day He arose again,
according to the Scriptures,
and ascended into Heaven,
and sits at the right hand of the Father;
and He shall come again with glory to judge
the living and the dead;
Whose Kingdom shall have no end.

**And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of Life,
Who proceeds from the Father;
Who with the Father and the Son
together is worshipped and glorified;
Who spoke by the prophets.**


Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed


**“Do you believe in Christ Jesus, Son of God,
