






Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the LORD, "and will bring you back from captivity.









and who meditates on his law day and night.




That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither — whatever they do prospers.

Has he in anger withheld his compassion?"


Psalm 77:10-12

and meditate on all your mighty deeds."




As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?






These things I remember as I pour out my soul: how I used to go to the house of God under the protection of the Mighty One with shouts of joy and praise among the festive throng.








My soul is downcast within me; therefore I will remember you from the land of the Jordan, the heights of Hermon — from Mount Mizar.


John 1:29-42 application:

- * Example to imitate: John the Baptist

- * Promise to claim: "Come and you will see."
- * Warning to heed: The gospel will change you.

- * Ask questions for application.
- * Emphasize one word at a time.
- * Paraphrase a passage.
- * Memorize a passage.




1 Peter 1:6-7

In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith — of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire — may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed.

1 Peter 1:8-9

your law is within my heart."


Hebrews 10:5-6
