


## Acts 28:14-15






### Acts 28:17

Three days later he called together the local Jewish leaders. When they had assembled, Paul said to them: "My brothers, although I have done nothing against our people or against the customs of our ancestors, I was arrested in Jerusalem and handed over to the Romans.

#### Acts 28:18-19

"They examined me and wanted to release me, because I was not guilty of any crime deserving death. The Jews objected, so I was compelled to make an appeal to Caesar. I certainly did not intend to bring any charge against my own people.



#### Acts 28:21-22

They replied, "We have not received any letters from Judea concerning you, and none of our people who have come from there has reported or said anything bad about you. But we want to hear what your views are, for we know that people everywhere are talking against this sect."


#### Acts 28:23

They arranged to meet Paul on a certain day, and came in even larger numbers to the place where he was staying. He witnessed to them from morning till evening, explaining about the kingdom of God, and from the Law of Moses and from the Prophets he tried to persuade them about Jesus.

### Acts 28:24-25

Some were convinced by what he said, but others would not believe. They disagreed among themselves and began to leave after Paul had made this final statement:


"The Holy Spirit spoke the truth to your ancestors when he said through Isaiah the prophet:



### Acts 28:27


"For this people's heart has become calloused; they hardly hear with their ears, and they have closed their eyes.

Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts and turn, and I would heal them."



# Matthew 13:16-17

[Jesus to disciples]: "But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear. For truly I tell you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it."





For two whole years Paul stayed there in his own rented house and welcomed all who came to see him. He proclaimed the kingdom of God and taught about the Lord Jesus Christ — with all boldness and without hindrance!

- \* He was arrested and executed under Nero in AD 64.




- \* After 1st missionary journey: Galatians

   Romans; 1 and 2 Corinthians


#### Paul's letters
