

What happened at Pentecost?

- Step four of our salvation:
 Incarnation, Crucifixion, Resurrection,
 Baptism of Holy Spirit
- * The Apostles were equipped for their mission.
- * The church was inaugurated.



* The first revival introduced the community to the presence of God.



- * Gives you a glimpse of your future.
- * Shows you all of the goodness of God.
- * Puts you in touch with "the nations."



- * They were obedient to Jesus.
- * They were devoted to prayer.
- * They had a high view of Scripture.

Acts 2:1-2

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting.



- Fifty days after Passover
- * It followed the Festival of Firstfruits/Weeks
- * Moses received the Law at Mount Sinai.
- * The Holy Spirit filled the Apostles.

Romans 8:20-21

For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

Romans 8:22-23

We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies.

Exodus 33:19

Exodus 34:6-7

Acts 2:12-13


