





Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

"You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the LORD, "and will bring you back from captivity."








- What does it give? perspective, strength, intimacy with God
- Where does it lead? self-awareness, trust, surrender








- * We sinned and lost it at the Garden of Eden.

- * Jesus removed the barrier.


















- * Have I avoided people or tasks that I know I should face?


"It was a notable event for God to put heaven, in some sense, under the control of Elijah's prayer, to be obedient to his requests."




They all plotted together to come and fight against Jerusalem and stir up trouble against it. But we prayed to our God and posted a guard day and night to meet this threat.

"Go and tell Hezekiah, 'This is what the LORD, the God of your father David, says: I have heard your prayer and seen your tears; I will add fifteen years to your life.








"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

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


James 5:13-14


James 5:15-16




Luke 18:7-8
